Palliative Care?

Palliative Care is a unique concept of care designed to help terminally ill patients and their families live life fully and with dignity, and to help loved ones cope after death.

Eaton Community Palliative Care supports this philosophy of care by placing control of care in the patient's hands, supporting the patient and family as a "unit of care," at home or at one of our two Palliative Care residences.

Palliative care is intended to ease pain without curing, neither prolonging life nor hastening death. Palliative care includes the patient and family as part of the team and provides the education and support the family needs to participate in caring for the patient.
